## Description

American Reconstruction Era. Composition a captioned "We regard the Reconstruction Acts (so called) of Congress as usurpations, and unconstitutional, revolutionary, and void" from the "Democratic Platform" typeset beneath title in black ink. Composition b captioned "Lady \*\*\*\*\*\*\*. 'Out damned spot! Out, I say!..... Here's the smell of the blood still: all the perfumes of Democ- / racy will not sweeten this little hand. Oh! oh! oh!" typeset beneath title in black ink. Composition b occupies the top left of the sheet, spanning two-thirds the width and a half the height.
