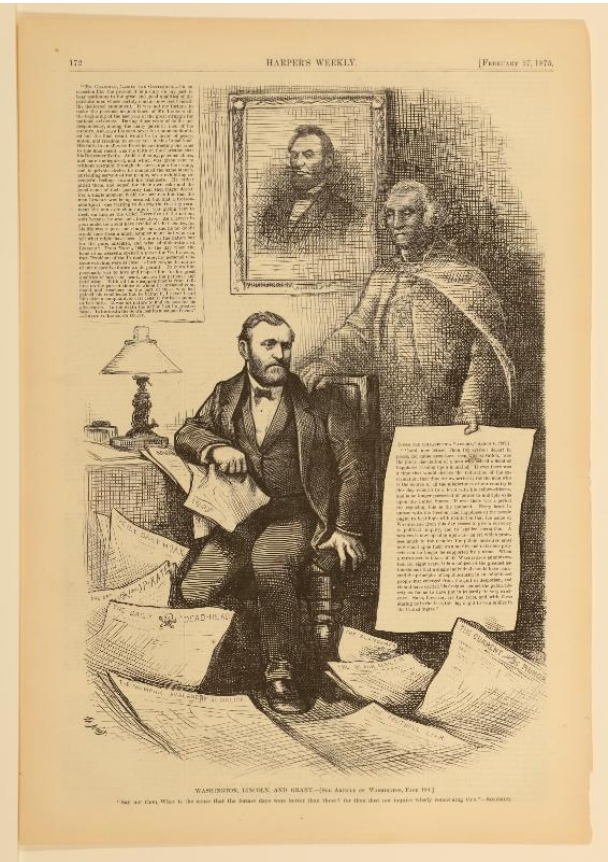




Washington, Lincoln, and Grant, from "Harper's Weekly"
